


DEVELOPING A WALKING CULTURE

- Legend:**
- Thin yellow line is City of Whitehorse boundary
 - Thick red lines are power lines
 - Thin yellow lines are cut lines
 - Thin blue lines and blue areas are streams and wetlands
 - Medium greyish line is White Pass & Yukon Route rail line
 - Thick brown lines are roads
 - Thin orange lines are tracks & trails
 - Thick green lines are paved city trails or sidewalks. Most sidewalks are not marked.
 - Medium thick blueish green lines are public right-of-ways in neighbourhoods
 - Thick blue lines are trails to be developed or paved by the city. These are not necessarily routes at present; other lines are for the city and community groups to develop future paths and sidewalks.
 - Thick reddish pink lines are mountainous routes authorized by City and are accessible by bike
 - Medium orange lines are public trails, both official city and others. Trail names are in yellow
 - Black lines are private trails. Trail names are in black
 - Thin orange lines are winter ski trails requiring a paid WCSC pass. When crossing, don't stop in the tracks. Trail names are in cyan/blue. Free public use at other times of year.
 - Thin orange lines are city trails; however, they are only usable by ski club pass holders for snowshoeing or during winter. Free public use at other times of year.
 - Chadburn Lake ski trails are free, community use, red, blue, green and yellow. Avoid walking in tracks.

 - Pink: park (community)
 - White: lake jumps
 - Yellow: yellow recreational
 - Orange: playground
 - Red: tennis court
 - Blue: fishing pier
 - Green: soccer field

 - Green: city utility (pump houses, reservoir)
 - Red: accommodations
 - Red: RV parks
 - Red: community centre
 - Red: visitor information
 - Red: trail infrastructure
 - Red: sign
 - Red: rock, old cabins, ruins, outcrops
 - Red: beach volleyball
 - Red: tennis court
 - Red: basketball court
 - Red: rock climbing
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
