

Little Wolf Creek Loop, 4.0 km

This walk takes you along Wolf Creek through Yukon's boreal forest and then along the Yukon River. The campground is a Territorial Campground with 50 sites,..... This is also in the area designated as Wolf Creek Park in the 2010 OCP. The park goes back.....

Watch for the old numbered posts as you walk along. Stay alert and you may see some of the birds and other animals that live here, and the plants that grow and flower in the boreal forest. Please don't pick them, so others can enjoy them too.

Trailhead: Park in the Wolf Creek Campground. In winter, you'll need to park outside the gates. There's even a kitchen shelter and campfire pits for later if you want a break after the hike.

1: Walk back towards the road and take the campground road on the left just below the highway. Follow it through the campground, staying on the main road. After 700 m, you'll cross a small bridge over Wolf Creek.

2: Just after the bridge, take the trail on your right through the woods. It will shortly be alongside Wolf Creek. Follow it as it winds among the big trees. After 1 km you'll be at the junction of a main trail.

3: Follow the main trail about 360 m along the top of the banks until you reach a cutline.

4: Turn right along the cutline trail and follow it until you come out on the banks of the Yukon River.

5: There's a delightful viewpoint here looking up and down the river with good views of the north ridges of Mount McIntyre and Grey Mountain. Continue about 400 m along the river.

6: You'll come to the official viewing platform. Take the trail leading away from the river and follow it 750 m.

7: This is an trailhead for a shorter loop. There's even an outhouse here. Turn right and follow the main campground road about 500 m back to the trailhead where you started.
